

The Coding Connection

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Mediasite: Mediasite is used to hold an interactive **live** presentation over the internet. Participants access the presentation via a web-browser on their computer and receive audio and video of the presenter and also whatever is on the presenter's screen. Participants have the ability of asking questions during a live conference via the built-in email functions of the viewer window. Participants also have the ability of viewing the archived session anytime after the live session is completed.

Teleconference: Teleconference is the live exchange of information among persons remote from one another but linked via phone.

Webcast: The word webcast is derived from "web" and "broadcast." Webcasting is sending noninteractive streams of audio and/or video live over the Internet. In essence, webcasting is broadcasting over the Internet. Participants sit at their own computers and view and listen to a presentation over the Internet.

Web Conference: Web conferencing is derived from "web" and "teleconference." Web conferencing is used to hold group meetings or live presentations over the Internet. In a web conference, each participant sits at their own computer and is connected via the Internet, whereby they can see whatever is on the presenter's screen. This is accompanied by voice communication, typically through a traditional telephone conference.

Date: June 7th, 2007

Topic: Official Coding Guideline Updates and POA Indicator Guidelines

Description: CMS and NCHS released updates to the Official Coding Guidelines November 2006. This session will review the updates/changes and discuss the impacts that these changes have upon assignments and sequencing of ICD codes. These guidelines also entailed the guidelines for the newly developed Present on Admission Indicators. Sheila will provide a thorough description of the POA Indicators, share guidelines for reporting purposes, and offer case scenarios. Sheila will also inform participants about the development of the Wisconsin POA Workgroup - their mission and progress.

Topic: ICD-9-CM Coding Updates

Description: This session will describe all newly developed ICD-9-CM codes, inform of all deleted codes, and review those codes that are revised in nature. All changes are effective October 1, 2007, so Coders are encouraged to participate to ensure they are aware of all pertinent changes.

Date: December 6th, 2007

Topic: 2008 CPT Changes and OPPS Updates

Description: This session will describe all newly developed CPT codes, inform of all deleted codes and review those codes that are revised in nature. All changes are effective January 1, 2008, so outpatient Coders are encouraged to participate to ensure they are aware of all pertinent changes. Because CPT codes entail Chargemaster functions, Sheila will provide added, deleted, revised code listings so that you may share with hospital staff to ensure your Chargemaster is updated and minimize returned claims due to outdated CPT codes. Sheila will also provide the 2008 OPPS changes as available from CMS.

Session agendas may also include pertinent hot topics to ensure timely notification of regular CMS updates and revisions.
